

# **2017 Topical Module: Experiences with Writing**Profile of Participating Institutions and Respondents and All Bachelor's-Granting U.S. Institutions and Students

Topical modules are short sets of questions on a topic related to current issues in higher education and student engagement that may be appended to the core survey. The **Experiences with Writing** module touches on three content areas: interactive writing processes, meaning-making writing tasks, and clarity of writing expectations. In 2017, 60 U.S. institutions elected to append these items to the core survey. Of these, 58 belonged to one of the eight Carnegie classifications shown in the table below.<sup>a</sup>

The institutions and respondents participating in a given module are only a subset of all NSSE participating institutions and respondents. The table below displays the characteristics for module participants alongside NSSE 2017 participants as well as all bachelor's-granting U.S. institutions and students (all limited to the eight indicated Carnegie Classification categories).
