STUDY PURPOSE

- Better understand the relationship between students' residential conditions, their engagement, and ultimately persistence.
- Will utilize data from
 - NSSE's core survey
 - Additional questions about students' on- and off-campus living arrangements
 - Institution-level data from ACUHO-I Campus Housing Index and IPEDS
 - Enrollment records obtained from the National Student Clearinghouse

STUDY ELIGIBILITY

- U.S. institutions that offer residential housing
- Participation in NSSE 2018

We are seeking the participation of approximately 75 institutions.

TIMELINE

- Now-September 22: Register for NSSE
- September-November: Customize your NSSE admin. & submit population files
- February-May 2018: NSSE administration
- Late Summer-Fall 2018: Standard NSSE reports delivered to schools
- Winter 2018/2019: Retention reporting delivered to schools
- 2019-2020: Analyze study's data

WHAT WE NEED FROM YOU

- Participate in the 2018 administration of NSSE
- Include sophomores in the population file
- Include dates of birth (MM/DD/YYYY) in the population file (to facilitate obtaining Fall 2018 enrollment data from the National Student Clearinghouse)
- Participate in the 2017-2018 administration of the [ACUHO-I Campus Housing Index](#), an institution-level data collection on campus housing; usually completed by administrators in the campus housing office.

PARTICIPATION BENEFITS

In addition to NSSE's standard report package and data, you will receive:

- A free sophomore oversample (valued at \$0.50 per student) and a customized report of sophomore engagement. (As a reminder, NSSE's standard administration is to first-year students and seniors.)
- A registration fee waiver (\$300)
- Additional survey items designed for the study about student living environments – coming soon. (You will still be able to select one Topical Module or join a system or consortium that asks additional questions.)
- A retention report using enrollment records obtained from the National Student Clearinghouse
- A customized report and data on student living environments

First-Year/Sophomore Questions

Asks details about their current living situation including:

- Type of building
- Roommates
- Participation in programming
- Commute to campus
- Sense of safety/community
- Academic support
- Financial concerns

Senior Questions

- Asks details about housing choices
- Factors influencing housing decisions
- Perceptions of on-campus and off-campus living at their institution
- Resources available to them
